### Responsibilities

- Plan summer trainings attended by HEAL fellows from around the world, contributing to both curriculum and event logistics
- Participate in the execution of 1-week training on the Navajo Nation in Arizona, and 3-week training in Santa Cruz and Berkeley, California, taking on tasks and responsibilities alongside others on team
- Specific areas of responsibility could include coordinating a hands-on training session; meals, travel, and housing logistics; creating printed materials; and managing documentation of sessions.

### Qualifications

- Passion for health equity/health justice
- Interest & some background knowledge in global health, underserved medicine, or social medicine
- Full time availability early June—late July
- Ability and willingness to travel offsite with team for 1 week in late June and 3 weeks in early July
- Competency in Microsoft Word, Excel, and PowerPoint; Adobe Illustrator and PhotoShop
- Excellent communication skills, solid time management, ability to manage multiple deadlines; practiced in working in teams & independently
