Position Title: Family Medicine HEAL Fellow

Tsehootsooi Medical Center is a 245,000 square foot state of the art rural hospital that opened in August 2002. The hospital is located in the beautiful high-desert climate of Northeastern Arizona, about 8 miles north of Window Rock, Arizona (the capitol of the Navajo Nation). Tsehootsooi Medical Center boasts a 24/7 Community Hospital Emergency Department, and is licensed for 56 inpatient beds including: an Intensive Care Unit; a Medical-Surgical Unit; a Pediatric Ward; an OB/GYN Ward; and an inpatient Adolescent Psychiatric Care Unit.

Department: Family Medicine

The Family Medicine Department consists of 8 full time FM and IM MDs, 3 NPs, 2 PAs, several case managers, and several nurses, medical assistants, clerks, social workers, dieticians, and pharmacists who all work together to make up the clinic structure.

Position Description: The position is 20% Inpatient Care and 80% Outpatient Care as well as walk-in clinic duties. HEAL Fellows are also welcome to participation in our sister clinic, mobile health unit, home visits, jail medicine, school medicine, and other outreach activities. Fellows can also partake in project work that aligns with departmental priorities. Spectrum of care can be tailored to fellow interest.

Job Requirements: By 1 July 2020 applicants must have completed residency training at a US-based residency program. Applicants must be able to provide highly competent clinical care, be adaptable, and have a clear passion for serving the underserved. Also important is the ability to function with limited specialty consultation and to have a genuine compassionate nature to serve a disenfranchised population.

HEAL Initiative

The HEAL Initiative aims to train and support health providers to thrive in hard places by fostering a community of front line health professionals dedicated to serving the underserved. HEAL is an immersive two-year fellowship dedicated to health equity and catalyzing life experience serving the underserved.
