Position Title: Hospitalist HEAL Fellow

The Division of Hospital Medicine (DHM) is a national leader in clinical care, education, and research. Hospitalists care for inpatients on the general medicine service at UCSF Medical Center, as well as on the medical consult service, palliative care service, neurosurgery comanagement service, oncology hospitalist service, congestive heart failure hospitalist service, procedure service, and nighttime medical service. In addition to their clinical work, the Division of Hospital Medicine focuses on excellence in teaching, research, and quality improvement. Dr. Phouc Le, Dr. Sriram Shamasunder, Dr. Wu and several advisors are embedded in DHM at UCSF.

Department: Hospital Medicine:

The Division of Hospital Medicine has over 75 faculty members providing care to patients and teaching residents.

Position Description: The position is 100% inpatient care and based at UCSF in San Francisco. UCSF DHM HEAL fellow will have time on the teaching wards with UCSF housestaff as well as the medicine consult service. Fellows can expect to have overnight hospitalist duties with teaching responsibilities of residents. Rotating HEAL Fellows are encouraged to participate in quality improvement projects and attend meetings of their interest outside of their clinical duties. This HEAL position is optimal for those interested to be hospital based in a large academic center.

Job Requirements: By 1 July 2020 applicants must have completed residency training at a US-based residency program in Internal Medicine or Medicine/Pediatrics. Applicants must be able to provide highly competent inpatient and outpatient care and have a clear passion for serving the underserved. Also important is the ability to function with limited specialty consultation, an expansive procedural skill set for invasive procedures, and a genuine altruistic nature to serve a disenfranchised population.

HEAL Initiative

The HEAL Initiative aims to train and support health providers to thrive in hard places by fostering a community of front line health professionals dedicated to serving the underserved. HEAL is an immersive two-year fellowship dedicated to health equity and catalyzing life experience serving the underserved.
