



HEAL Initiative Fellow Role Description

Position Title: Primary Care HEAL Fellow

Organization: [Zuni Comprehensive Community Health Center \(ZCCHC\)](#)

The Zuni Comprehensive Community Health Center (ZCCHC) is located on the Zuni Pueblo, about 150 miles west of Albuquerque, NM in a beautiful high desert landscape. We serve a very traditional and rural Native population of about 14,000, with about 60% of our patients coming from the Zuni Tribe and 40% from the surrounding Navajo community. Both Tribes have wonderfully intact cultures, and the Zuni and Navajo languages, customs, and religious practices are a part of everyday life. ZCCHC strives to care for the entire community in a holistic, strength-based way by providing full-spectrum Family Medicine, including 24/7 emergency care, primary care, inpatient care (with a typical census of 5-15), OB care, and specialty care (i.e. psychiatry, dental, optometry, physical therapy, podiatry). Our medical staff consists of 20 physicians and one NP. We also have a strong student/ resident program and are deeply involved at the community level through a variety of outreach programs.

Position Description: Fellows will have the same schedule as our attending physicians, which includes a frequent rotation of emergency medicine, outpatient clinic, inpatient and OB care. Fellows can expect to have approximately 10 hours of administrative time per week. Outside of clinical time, HEAL fellows have the opportunity to take on key roles on several quality improvement or research projects (e.g. community-based youth suicide prevention, improving parental education and preventing childhood trauma, improving quality indicators in the ED). The medical staff would work closely with fellows to determine meaningful, yet realistic, projects that incorporate both the interests of our fellows and our service unit needs.

Job Requirements: By 1 July 2021 applicants must have completed residency training at a US-based residency program. Training preferences are for Med/Peds or Family Medicine training. Applicants must have a clear passion for serving the underserved.
